REGULATION

Constitution of Botswana

The constitution of Botswana was adopted 1966 September 30th, it insists on the respect of fundamental human rights in the chapter 2 of the constitution. Whereas every person in Botswana rights and freedoms of the individual, that is to say, the right, whatever his race, place of origin, political opinions, colour, creed or sex, but subject to respect for the rights and freedoms of others and for the public interest to each and all of the particular rights:

- Life, liberty, security of person and the protection of the law

Guidelines

HRDC's guidelines for the review of research proposals also known as health research guidelines is a primary source of regulatory information, these guidelines are currently is being revised, another useful document is a guide to informed consent issued by the health research unit of the ministry of health.

Researchers are asked to submit the application for approval of human research to HRU, this latter may request more information before either providing an expedited review or forwarding a protocol to HRDC .
